Dear friends of D-Day Conneaut

As we prepare for D-Day Conneaut 2018, the nation's largest WWII and D-Day recreation, we invite you to join us for this exciting event. We also ask you to share this information with as many veterans as possible, especially those who served in the World War II or Korean War eras. **Our 2018 veterans program is 9:00AM to 5:00PM, Friday August 17 and Saturday August 18, 2018 at Conneaut Township Park, Conneaut, Ohio.**

In 2017, over 200 WWII and Korean War era veterans participated in our formal veterans' program. We are truly grateful and humbled that so many of these veterans choose to spend the weekend with us and we seek to make it a special, memorable experience.

As your host at the event, we make your attendance as easy as possible. D-Day Conneaut offers special veteran and wheelchair accessible shuttles from our nearby parking, and encourages family members to drop off and pick up veterans who may appreciate mobility assistance. Shaded seating and refreshments are available in our Veterans Hospitality Tent and golf cart transportation is available to the camp areas for those that may have difficulty travelling on foot.

D-Day Conneaut recognizes veterans of all eras, but asks that priority for seating be given to older veterans or those needing assistance, particularly WWII and Korean War era veterans.

Activities feature Veterans' Oral History speaking programs, a Friday luncheon for WWII and Korean War era veterans, rides aboard WWII landing craft, a Veterans Recognition program, and four recreated battle scenarios related to the Normandy Invasion. Additionally, over 1,000 living historians attend to faithfully recreate WWII era military and civilian life. Veterans and their families are encouraged to tour the recreated camp and living history displays and demonstrations. See the FAQs for more detailed information.
